Phase - 3rd Grade

FOR A THIRD GRADER LIFE IS ALL ABOUT WHAT IS FUN. THEY ARE GROWING IN CONFIDENCE IN THEIR ABILITIES AND NOW IT'S TIME TO PARTY! THEY COULD BE PLAYING A GAME OR DOING THE DISHES, BUT IT DOESN'T MATTER IF THEY ARE HAVING FUN DOING IT. TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO BOND AND MAKE SOME UNFORGETTABLE MEMORIES WITH YOUR KID.



- Still losing those baby teeth and could gain seven pounds.
- Getting better with hand-eye coordination.
- You may need to remind them to take short breaks because they play hard and tire quickly.
- Needs about 10-11 hours of shut eye.



- Collaborative group games and activities are fun.
- Things are very black and white, so evaluating what is fair is very important to them. Helping them see there can be gray areas in life is helpful.
- When making friends they may prefer hanging out with friends of a particular gender.
- Having a large friend group is now the norm. Your kid will need help navigating peer pressure, because "everyone" is doing it.



- As they grow cognitively, they can concentrate on an activity for up to 30 minutes.
- They are getting better at noticing the feelings of others.
- At this stage they can identify patterns and symbolism.
- Books can be read for learning and fun.

• Their cognitive abilities are growing. They need to focus on one thing at a time. They are just beginning to understand abstract concepts. The more you can make parallels between the concrete and abstract the more they will learn to understand.

They see right and wrong as black and white.

EMOTIONALLY

• Being enthusiastic and energetic is where they live, but impatience can be lurking around the corner.

- At this phase your kid is confident and independent. They can do it!
- They can be judgmental about themselves by quickly labeling ("smart" vs. "not smart").
- Jokes, riddles, and magic tricks help them to develop their sense of humor, so brush up on your card tricks and pull out that joke book. They will come in handy.
