

# Week 1: Know It

#### WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO HAVE GODLY RELATIONSHIPS?

- A. You will always become like the people you are closest to.
  - I. 1 Corinthians 15:33: "Do not be deceived: Bad company ruins Good morals."
    - a. Reflect on a situation when maybe you felt someone was influencing you to do something you knew was not right (e.g. swearing, gossiping, lying).
      - i. The Bible tells us that we are in the world, but we are not of the world (John 17:16).
        - 1) Being in a relationship with other believers means that each of us is sanctified in the truth, and can push each other to what His Word says instead of what the world says.

### HOW DO I DEVELOP GODLY RELATIONSHIPS IN MY LIFE?

- A. Hebrews 10:24-25: "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."
  - I. We are encouraged to gather together on a regular basis (e.g. SOZO each week, in small groups, serving, Bible studies, and celebrating the wins in each other's lives).

### WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF COMING TO CHURCH?

- A. It reminds us of what the Word of God says and how to live out a life the Lord has called us to.
- B. The three most important assignments for a church are to:
  - I. Evangelize, Care, and Disciple
    - a. Evangelism: Spreading the love of Jesus by public preaching or witnessing
    - b. Care: To look after and provide needs for members of the congregation
    - c. Disciple: To help others know and follow Jesus as they take their next step with Him
  - II. Ephesians 4:12-13: "...to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ until we all achieve the unity of faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."
    - a. Equip: To provide someone with what they need to fulfill their God-given purpose
    - b. Unity: Bringing together different people and giftings by FAITH in Christ



## Week 2: Have It

#### POP QUIZ: WHOEVER ANSWERS CORRECTLY GETS A PRIZE!

- A. What are the three most important areas a church must shepherd their people in?I. Evangelism, Care, and Discipleship.
- B. What does it mean to evangelize?
  - I. Spreading the love of Jesus by public preaching or witnessing.
- C. What does it mean to care?I. To look after and provide needs for members of the congregation.
- D. What does it mean to be discipled?
  - I. To help others know and follow Jesus as they take their next step in their walk with the Lord.

#### ΑCTIVITY

- A. Pass out two notecards to each member of the group.
- B. Have students take three minutes and make a list on one side of the notecard to identify characteristics they want to have in a Godly friendship.
  - a. On the other side of the notecard, have the students identify qualities about themselves that make them Godly friends to others.
- C. Have the students go around in a circle and share what they wrote down on their lists.
- D. Put all the notecards in the middle and as a group pray over the notecards and the students that the Lord would bring them these friendships!

#### NEXT STEP

- A. Jesus did not come to be served BUT to serve others and lay down His own life.
  - I. How can you serve others with your life and make an impact?
    - a. Children's ministry, café, welcome team, worship, etc.
    - b. Take your students to the Starting Point booth if they desire to take this next step.



## Week 3: Share It

#### DISCUSS WITH THE STUDENTS: WHAT ARE SOME REASONS YOUR FRIENDS MAY NOT KNOW THE IMPORTANCE OF A GODLY FRIENDSHIP OR COME TO CHURCH?

- A. They didn't grow up in church.
- B. They don't surround themselves with other Godly friends.
- C. They didn't receive Jesus into their hearts.

#### SMALL GROUP LEADER: SHARE A STORY ABOUT A TIME YOU INVITED A FRIEND TO CHURCH OR A GODLY FRIENDSHIP YOU HAVE AND HOW IT HAS IMPACTED YOUR LIFE.

#### OPEN UP THE DISCUSSION FOR OTHER STUDENTS TO SHARE EXPERIENCES WITH CHURCH OR FRIENDS THAT HAVE HAPPENED INSIDE OF SOZO.

- A. Have there been any friendships you have made in SOZO that have impacted your life?
- B. Was there a specific message or time in worship that accelerated your relationship with God?

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- A. Revisit Point 1: Have the students identify 1-2 people they can share what they have learned over the last 3 weeks!
  - a. This could be someone from the student's school, sports team, or a student off the Shepherding Report who has not been back to church.
- B. Have each student identify 1-2 people they want to text to invite to church or to make plans with outside of the church.
- C. Help each student with a message:
  - a. "Hey \_\_\_\_\_! We miss you so much at SOZO! In service this month we have been learning so much about \_\_\_\_\_. Next week during service we have \_\_\_\_\_. I would love to see you. How can I help to make sure you can be here?"
  - b. "Hey \_\_\_\_\_! I hope you are doing well. I wanted to text you and see if you have anything going on next Wednesday. I am going to church, and I wanted to invite you to come with me! In church, we will be having \_\_\_\_\_\_."
  - c. Small Group leaders and students can create their own messages based on the students and friends! These are just some examples.
- D. Send messages together!
- E. Celebrate the students! They have learned so much over the last three weeks.
